

Lecturer in Broadcast Journalism

The Journalism Department of the University of Georgia's Grady College of Journalism and Mass Communication invites applications for a full-time, non-tenure-track faculty position, at the rank of Lecturer, to begin in August 2019.

Faculty salary/rank

Lecturer salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Responsibilities

The person hired for this position will teach undergraduate classes in broadcast and digital news, which include reporting, writing and producing, and journalism ethics. The individual selected will serve as the executive producer of daily student-driven newscasts that serve the Northeast Georgia audience. The Grady College news facility includes a computerized newsroom, a dedicated news studio and extensive digital video equipment. Applicants must possess newsroom leadership skills, as well as an understanding of various multimedia platforms and how students can produce work to maximize the unique facets of each platform. Applicants must be familiar with broadcast and digital production techniques.

Qualifications

The successful candidate will have at least five years of recent industry experience, including in leadership roles. He or she will have a minimum of one year of teaching and/or mentoring experience. A doctoral or master's degree in mass communication or in a related field or discipline that has enhanced the candidate's work as a journalist is required. Candidates with a master's degree must document exceptional accomplishments in mass communication or in a related field or discipline that has enhanced the candidate's work as a journalist and must be approved for a terminal degree exception before hire.
